## The President's Corner by Ron Goans, MD

# Thoughts and Commentary on Psalm 23



Over the last three years we have gone through probably the worst of the covid crisis and, for some of us, serious health issues and trouble in our family. As I write this, I am reminded of Psalm 23 and Martin Luther's commentary:

### Psalm 23 (NRSV)

Martin Luther notes that the 23<sup>rd</sup> psalm is a psalm of thanks in which a Christian heart praises and thanks God for teaching him and keeping him on the right way, comforting and protecting him in every danger through His Holy Word. The psalmist compares himself to a sheep that a faithful shepherd leads into fresh grass and cool water.

*<sup>1</sup> The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. <sup>2</sup> He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters; <sup>3</sup> he restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake. <sup>4</sup> Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff — they comfort me. <sup>5</sup> You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. <sup>6</sup> Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord my whole life long.*

### A Prayer from Martin Luther<sup>1</sup>

Lord Jesus, who alone is that one Good Shepherd, thanks be unto You for all Your spiritual and bodily benefits. Let the Word of Your salvation dwell among us richly, and suffer not that trusty staff, the word of Your promise, to be taken from us. And when the shadow of death spreads over us, conduct us safely to the fold of the perfected saints, the tabernacle not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. Amen.

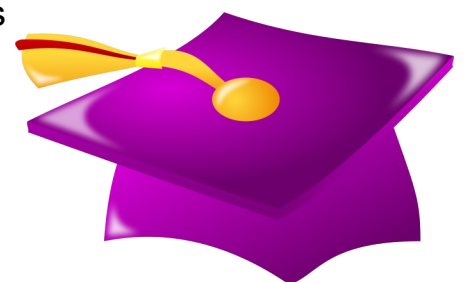

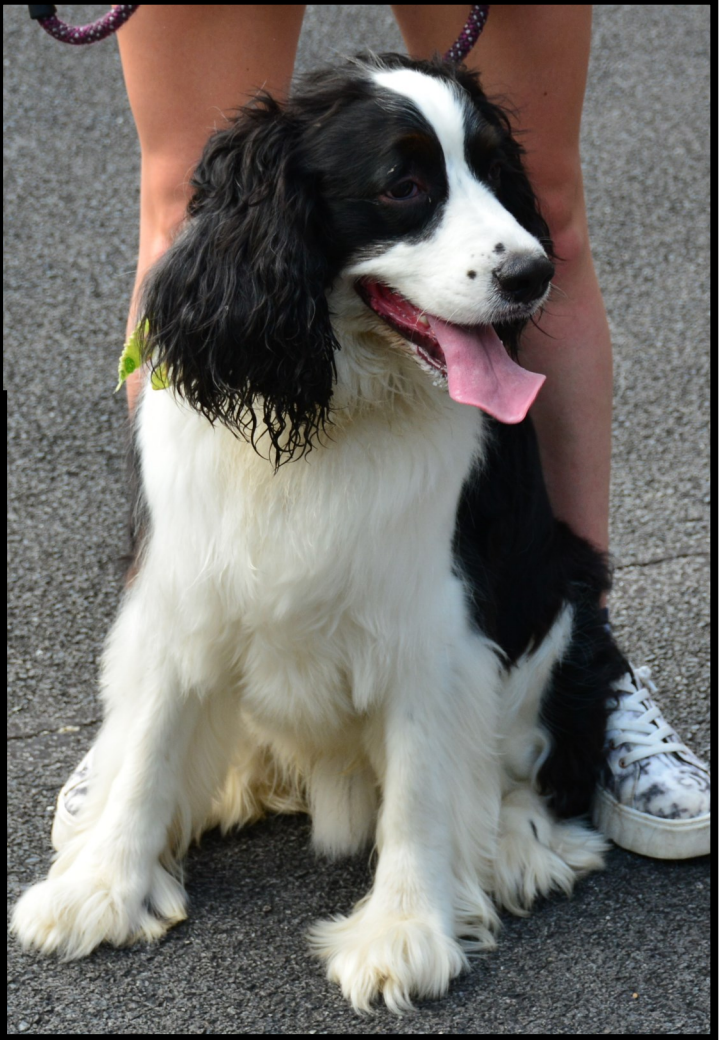
The committee asks for your prayers for wisdom and discernment as it goes through the interview process.

### Grace Wants Stories About Sharing Abundance

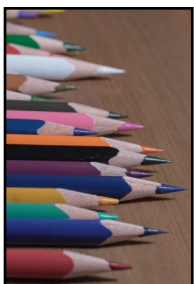

# Team Rubicon Participation Overwhelming Success

I was privileged the last two weeks to see first-hand how Lutheran Disaster Response interacts with other volunteer organizations.

Pastor Ingrid Schalk is a member of the SES Disaster Response Team. She was contacted by Mary Jane Olhasso, chair of the East Tennessee VOAD, a voluntary consortium of recognized state volunteer organizations active in disaster relief. She asked Pastor Ingrid if there was a Lutheran church in the Oak Ridge area that could help feed workers who were staying here while helping to clean up tornado damage.

This group was Team Rubicon, a nationwide organization of military and EMS workers, who volunteer to come where there is a disaster or humanitarian need and help out. Although based out of Los Angeles, every area of the country has a team and equipment ready to move in as soon as they are asked to help. For the last year, the local group has been working to clean up, and help with recovery in the areas of Kentucky that have been devastated by floods and tornadoes. Many of the group are now headed to Maui to help with communication and infrastructure needs.

Kate Amaral, from Middle Tennessee, is the team coordinator for Tennessee, Kentucky, Mississippi and Louisiana. She sent out a call for help and men and women from as far away as Colorado and Florida responded to Knoxville's needs. The majority came from a 150 mile radius of Oak Ridge. Several of the team members actually live in Oak Ridge and West Knoxville. These were very hard workers. They were up and on the work site shortly after 7 each morning and they did not quit until 5:30 or 6 every night.

Our church was originally asked to provide breakfasts each morning. Because of your generosity, as well as other groups who wanted to help, they soon had all that they needed for breakfasts for the two weeks they were here. We continued to supply items like milk, orange juice, ice and other items that needed to be replenished regularly. We also volunteered to provide two dinners the second week the team was here. I have to give a huge shoutout to Jeff Sipes, Lisa's husband, who fixed a hot breakfast the first week and a pork tenderloin dinner the second week. His meals were greatly appreciated. We also treated the team to Big Ed's pizzas, salad, and ice cream this past Wednesday.

There were so many from Grace who contributed food, money, shopping, and hands to deliver the food. I don't even know who some of you were and I would almost certainly leave people out if I started trying to thank everyone. If you helped in any way, please know that Team Rubicon, the Southeastern Synod, and East Tennessee VOAD are all most appreciative of the help that Grace gave.

Dear Members of Grace:

Team Rubicon, the SE SYNOD Disaster Response Team and I are overwhelmed by your generosity and giving spirit!! You have exceeded what I knew you would do by a great margin! We cannot thank you enough.

At this time, we do not need anything more even though the team may have to extend their stay for a few days. You have answered the question, "Can we feed thirty people for a week?" with a resounding "YES!"

You are indeed the hands of Jesus. Many, many thanks to all who responded with food, money and your time. You have truly blessed the Lord.
